

2022 Oregon Girls Championship – March 12

The 2022 Oregon Girls Championship will be held on Saturday, March 12 at the Portland Chess Center. This is the qualifier for the [Haring Tournament](#) which will be held July 30 through August 2 in Rancho Mirage, California.

Eligibility: Open to all K-12 girls living in Oregon.

Format: 5-round Swiss in one section. US Chess ratings will be used for pairings and prize eligibility. One half-point bye is available if requested before round one.

Time Control: G/40;inc5 (forty minutes per player with a five second increment each move).

Schedule: The rounds are scheduled for 10am, 12noon, 2 pm, 4pm, and 6pm. Players who have a game go long can request extra time off before the next round.

Registration: Use [this online form](#) to register. Registration deadline is Friday, March 11 at 7pm.

Entry Fee: \$20. Send the money via PayPal to email@pdxchess.org or mail a check to OCF Treasurer Mike Morris at 2344 NE 27th Ave, Portland, OR, 97212.

Membership Requirements: US Chess. See <https://new.uschess.org/join-us-chess> for more information.

Covid Protocols: Masks are required for everyone, and your mask must cover your nose and mouth. Everyone's temperature will be taken Saturday morning. Anyone with a temperature of at least 100.4°F or is not feeling well will not be allowed to play.

Rated: US Chess and NWSRS rated.

Prizes: Trophies for 1st, 2nd, 1st U1200/unrated, 1st U1000/unrated, and 1st U800/unrated. Ties will be broken based on the US Chess recommended tiebreaks.

Title/Haring Qualifier: The winner (determined through tiebreaks if necessary) receives the title of 2022 Oregon Girls Champion and will be given the opportunity to represent Oregon at the prestigious [2022 Ruth Haring National Tournament of Girls State Champions](#). The Haring representative will receive \$100 in monetary support from the Oregon Chess Federation to attend the tournament if the tournament is held in-person.
